

Baylor University's George W. Truett Theological Seminary seeks an **Associate or Full Professor (Tenure-track or Tenured) for The Lampsato Chair in Baptist World Missional Engagement and Director of the Baptist World Alliance Program** with a preferable start date of August 1, 2026 but negotiable. Qualifications – Candidates must possess an earned research doctorate, such as a Ph.D., Th.D., or Ed.D., in an appropriate field of study no later than December 31, 2025. Prior classroom and ministry experience will be valued highly. Preference will be given to those with a M.Div. Additionally, candidates must be committed to the Baptist tradition with evidence of active involvement in Baptist church life.

Responsibilities – Teaching, Administration, Research, and Service: Candidates should have administrative experience and the ability to interface with Baptist constituents worldwide. Candidates should have a research agenda and the ability to publish. Candidates should have the capacity to teach courses in the areas of Baptist History, Polity, Theology, and/or Witness.
